2. Minutes of the Meeting of April 27, 2023

4. Innovating Academic-Industry Collaborations at UConn Tech Park
Presentation by Emmanouil N. Anagnostou, Board of Trustees Distinguished Professor
Eversource Energy Endowed Chair in Environmental Engineering

Interim Executive Director, UConn Tech Park

Dr. Anagnostou gave a presentation on innovating academic-industry collaborations, which include 4 pillars: Energy/Sustainability; Cybersecurity; Systems/Manufacturing; and Defense. Efforts continue to attract new industry partnerships.

5. Research, Entrepreneurship and Innovation Opportunities in Aging: Some Highlights Presentation by George A. Kuchel, M.D.

Professor of Medicine, Travelers Chair in Geriatrics and Gerontology Director, UConn Center on Aging

Dr. Kuchel presented opportunities in aging and the importance of interdisciplinary approaches to issues regarding demographics, health, independence of aging, and health care costs. UConn's Center on Aging is now the home of a prestigious Claude D. Pepper Older Americans Independence Center and is one of 15 "Pepper Centers" of excellence nationwide. The overarching goal of these centers is to restore function and independence in aging by bringing together basic science, human subject research, population data science, and the work of clinicians and educators to form an important collaboration for addressing these issues.
